have never been much of a plant person.

• Of course, I love to look at flowers, daffodils being my favorite. I love the smell of roses, the delicate texture of peonies, the bright openness of sunflowers. But I'm really not much of a plant person. I mean, it was a joyous occasion when, having received a poinsettia one Christmas I was able to keep it alive through Easter, setting a personal record. Whenever someone gives me a plant I am overjoyed with appreciations, but I softly whisper to the poor thing "I'll try to get you into someone else's care before I kill you."

I remember vividly as a small child visiting my grandmother's home, where she would spend hours planting in her flower beds. Each spring, ground would be turned over and new annuals placed in the soil. They looked amazing all the way through the summer, until the fall frost would set in. Then the beds would be left until the following spring when they were turned over and prepared for the next spring.

Except one bed. That was always treated differently. When I'd ask Nana about it, she would explain simply "That's where the perennials are." Somehow, like magic, flowers would sprout up and grow in that bed even though nothing new was planted. Of course, as I aged, I came to understand that "perennial" meant they could come back, year after year. It was a moment of fascination for me - how could it be possible? The plant grew, looked beautiful, and died. In spite of this, that same plant could just wait it out under the ground and be reborn the following spring, when the bright sun and ample water would allow it to grow into the beautiful flower it had been.

This image speaks strongly to the idea of the perennial rhythm of love. God loves us when we are seeds, when we grow into seedlings, as we burst out into flowers of color, as we regress into withering stems, and as we return to the ground. Birth and rebirth, life and renewal.




